Last but not least, the Foundation and the hospital have extended the operational management agreement for the parking.

As we look to the future, after a 30-year career in fundraising and 8 years at the helm of our Foundation, Marc Villeneuve will be retiring at the end of 2026. New projects and recognition initiatives are being rolled out during the 2026–2027 fiscal year, positively impacting the activities and work environment of our dedicated volunteers!



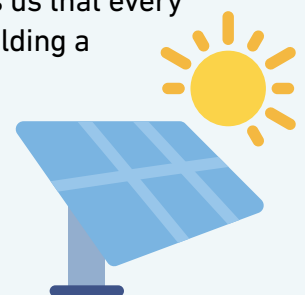
A green turn ahead on the roofs of Hôpital Montfort

The exceptional donation of \$500,000 from the **Ozerdinc-Grimes Family** played a pivotal role in the creation of the **Mental Health Emergency Zone (MHEZ)** at Hôpital Montfort.

This significant philanthropic gesture demonstrates a concrete commitment by **Ms. Kathleen Grimes and her family** to improving care and well-being in our community.

The first facility of its kind in the region, this zone offers a safe, calming environment tailored to patients' needs. Entirely funded by philanthropy, the MHEZ embodies a new approach to emergency mental health care and positions Montfort as a recognized and innovative leader.

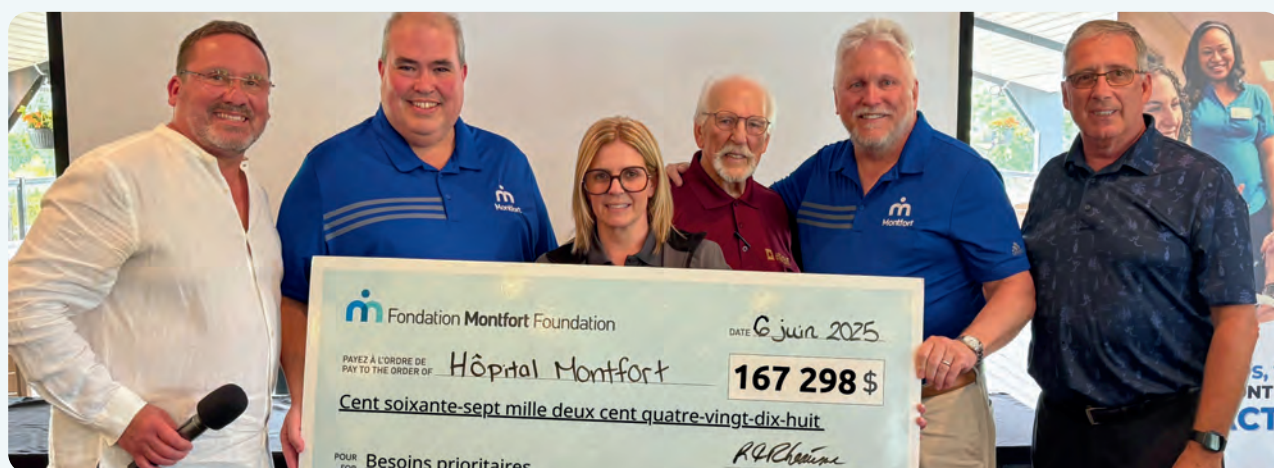

Journées Montfort - April 10–11, 2025

The Montfort Foundation continued to serve as the main sponsor of this event, attracting speakers, moderators, and participants from across Canada to a program focused on current health issues.

This event brings together doctors, nurses, research professionals, medical students and students in other health professions, as well as other stakeholders in the sector, on an annual basis.

For more than two decades, **Journées Montfort** have provided an opportunity to be at the center of discussions on health-related issues, the latest clinical advances, innovation, ethics, and multidisciplinary approaches that have transformed the way we approach health care.



Professor Justin Boutilier, an assistant professor at the University of Ottawa's Telfer School of Management and an internationally recognized expert in artificial intelligence applied to health, has been appointed to the new **Research Chair in Mental Health, Human-Technology Interaction, and Artificial Intelligence** at the Institut du Savoir Montfort.



New Research Chair in Mental Health and AI

In the context of an unprecedented mental health crisis, Montfort is breaking new ground by establishing this research chair that combines clinical expertise and artificial intelligence. Led by the ISM and supported by the Foundation, this chair will have a lasting impact, not only on our community but also on the entire healthcare system. A bold step toward a new way to address one of the greatest challenges of our time.

Frontlines & Founders Event - February 12, 2026

During the second edition of **Frontlines & Founders**, the ISM once again overturned the traditional concept of a pitch.

Supported by the Foundation, this event—designed for startups, investors, and innovators—is dedicated to advances in healthcare: innovative technologies, access to obstetric care, public health, digital patient engagement, and artificial intelligence.

Discussions focused on the real-world challenges that healthcare professionals face in providing patient care, which could be addressed through technological solutions.

Six \$1,500 scholarships were awarded this year in the fields of medicine, surgery, and mental health, in recognition of the talent and dedication of the next generation of nurses, who help promote French-language healthcare!



Montfort Academic Day - August 22, 2025



During these sessions, physicians present on a variety of medical topics and engage in discussions with the residents. The 2025–2026 cohort consisted of residents from various universities, including the University of Ottawa, the University of Buea (Faculty of Health Sciences, BUEA, Cameroon), McGill, Laval, and Sherbrooke, as well as medical schools in Poland and Anguilla.

These **residents in family medicine** stand out for their motivation, ambition, and desire to learn and advance in their medical careers. Resting pods for employees - \$18,465

Our partner Recharjme offers two relaxation pods for hospital employees, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with many benefits:

- Guided meditation
- Light therapy
- Thermotherapy
- Aromatherapy
- Easy booking via QR code and app



These cabins continue to be very popular among staff:

- 654 unique users
- A total of 6,457 reservations, averaging 538 per month, or 18 per day.

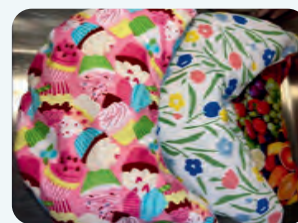
Well-being of Family Medicine residents - \$20,000

Initiated by Dr. Lyne Pitre of the Montfort Academic Family Health Team, this designated fund is supported by physicians, who contribute \$10,000 per year. The Foundation is pleased to match this amount, thereby enabling the provision of training, Montfort-branded jackets, and a recognition dinner for residents.



Cushions for breast cancer patients - \$2,985

Designed by a volunteer artist, Ms. Thérèse Montreuil, these post-operative pillows reduce the friction patients may experience after surgery. They are also given bags containing books, brochures, and other helpful information for the continuation of their treatment.



Furniture and audiovisual equipment - \$21,000

To improve the patient experience in the mental health sector.

Bladder scanner - \$15,520

Used in the Emergency department.

Wireless fetal monitor - \$38,000

For the Family Birthing Center.

Language Skills Enhancement program - \$100,129

This program enables new staff members to improve their French through a five-week immersion program and allows some of the current employees to improve their English as a second language. The program benefits from a generous matching grant from RBC Foundation, as well as endowment funds administered by the Ottawa Community Foundation.

Voyce application - \$17,600

Through a smart screen at patients' bedsides, this service provides real-time access to certified medical interpreters, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, in more than 240 languages and dialects. This program benefits from a generous matching grant from RBC Foundation, as well as from the Association des communautés francophones d'Ottawa (ACFO), through the *Ottawa Bilingue* program.



Training for gastroenterologists - \$9,691

Helping patients whose financial circumstances or personal situations are less favorable.

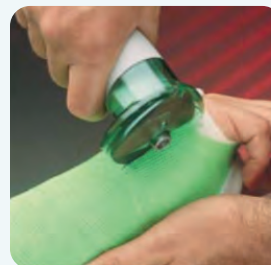
Technical Skills room - \$28,481

Montfort hosted the second annual Champlain Region NP Conference.



BUSINESS INITIATIVES

Proud Partners Program



The Montfort Foundation continues to develop targeted partnerships with key businesses that uphold the values of family, solidarity, and community support.

The agreements already in place with **Ferme avicole Laviolette** and **Fromagerie Saint-Albert** remain in effect (with an annual value of \$10,000 for a total of \$50,000 each), as well as with the rest pods provider **Recharjme**.

This year, the Foundation welcomed a new partner to its program: **All Seniors Care** residences.



Parking management

Since the fall of 2024, the Foundation has been overseeing the **management of parking facilities** at Hôpital Montfort and at the Aline-Chrétien Health Hub, for visitors and employees, including the operation and maintenance of the various parking lots.

This past year, a color-coded sticker system was implemented, and new signage was installed around the various lots.

Revenue generated in 2025–2026 totaled \$4,061,132.

All proceeds are redirected toward Montfort's emerging priorities.
